

Why You Might NOT Want to “E-File”

Aren't there advantages to filing Tax Returns electronically (**eFiling**) as opposed to “paper filing?” Sure. Here they are...

YOU like eFiling because:

1. You (supposedly) get your refund faster.
2. Saves you a trip to the Post Office.

YOUR TAX PRO likes eFiling because:

1. It's quick and efficient.
2. No papers to copy, file or and mail.
3. It helps you get your refund faster.

THE IRS LIKES IT BECAUSE:

1. It takes *waaaaay* fewer administrative people to process electronically-filed Tax Returns – so they can take those “excess admin positions,” and move them over to the Enforcement Division, enabling them to do more Audits.

When a “paper return” arrives at an IRS Processing Center, an administrative person sits at a keyboard and enters, into the vast IRS computer, the data you provided on your Tax Return and all Forms, Attachments and Schedules submitted with it. That's time consuming, and, of course, human errors are made.

2. Their computers can *automatically* compare the numbers you put on every line of every Form or Attachment of every Tax Return, with “national averages” -- giving them more justification to conduct more Audits.

When a “paper return” arrives, an administrative person enters, into the vast IRS computer, only **some** of the numbers from **some** of the lines on **some** of the Forms, Attachments and Schedules, not every line-item. It would be far too time-consuming to have them input all the data. This process restricts them to having only about 20% of your data, to cross-check with national averages.
